




1. "Invictus" by William Ernest Henley




3. "Ode to a Nightingale" by John Keats

4. "Do Not Go Gentle into That Good Night" by Dylan Thomas




Do not go gentle into that good night,


5. "I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud" by William Wordsworth


7. "When I Have Fears That I May Cease to Be" by John Keats

8. "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening" by Robert Frost




Whose woods these are I think I know.
